# QUALITIES OF A YOUNG LEADER

As part of one of the workshops, we asked the children what they thought a leader was:

"Someone who has the courage to help people improve and get better"

"A leader is someone who needs to be brave, patient, encouraging, prepared, kind, understanding and polite"

"A leader is a person that stays strong, a person that helps a person, is about being responsible and caring and patient"

"To be a young leader you need to be enthusiastic and to make them smile and encourage young children to be active in all that they do"

"A leader needs to respect people in their group and learn to be patient as well as understanding for others needs"

**98 %** said the conference has given them more confidence to be a young leader

**96 %** said they understood what a leader is and the skills needed

**89 %** said they would definitely use the things they had learnt at the conference
